LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Re: Beyond Anonymity

I write to you today as a long time member of Alcoholics Anonymous to make a comment or two in regards to the ridiculous state of affairs pertaining to the Traditions as they pertain to anonymity.

I was recently at a meeting where a member was attempting to ascertain if another member was attending the meeting. The inquiring member was quite new and when they asked if "Ed" would be at the meeting, the member was then met with a barrage of questions by other members who were all trying to identify to whom which "Ed" the member was referring to.

The questioning went along the lines of questions similar to this; Little Ed, Big Ed, Eddie, Ed from such and such a group, Ed the lawyer, Ed the Doctor, Ed the truck driver and so forth, the poor new person never stood a chance and at the end of the day never did get his question answered.

I would like to draw the attention of the members to a rather significant passage from Dr. Bob and the Good Oldtimers and attributed to Dr. Bob (see page 264) which reads as follows;

"If I got up and gave my name as Dr. Bob S. people who need help would have a hard time getting in touch with me

He (Dr. Bob) said there are two ways to break anonymity Traditions (1) by giving your name at the public level of press or radio; (2) by being so anonymous that you can't be reached by other drunks

Apparently in an article in the February 1969 issue of Grapevine a member wrote that Dr. Bob commented on the Eleventh Tradition as follows:

Since our Tradition on anonymity designates the exact level where the line should be held, it must be obvious to everyone who can read and understand the English language that to maintain anonymity at any other level is definitely a violation of this Tradition.

The A.A. who hides his identity from his fellow A.A. by using only a given name violates the Tradition just as much as the A.A. who permits his name to appear in the press in connection with matters pertaining to A.A.

THE CONFERENCE

In the pamphlet “Circles of Love and Service” states “All parts of our Fellowship- group meetings, committees, offices, Conferences, and group jobs have one joint purpose: to help that one newcomer who has a drinking problem”. In here you will find a short description of the General Service Conference, how and why it functions. This is where your Groups experience and concerns can be presented by the Area Delegate, who has previously been informed by the District Committee Member (DCM) at the Area Assembly, who was previously informed at the District Assembly or Meeting, by your Group Service Representative (GSR). You can find further information in the current General Service Manual,

THE FORUM

There are two types of Forum, where the General Service Structure from New York comes out to the members of AA either Regionally or Locally. The following details were compiled off the website provided a from <http://www.aa.org>

“Regional Forums originated in 1975 were to be weekend sharing and informational sessions designed to help the General Service Board, A.A. World Services, Inc., the Grapevine Corporate Board, the Grapevine Staff, and the General Service Office Staff stay in touch with A.A. members, trusted servants and newcomers to service throughout the A.A. service structure...In many places, area committees, districts and groups cover or defray the transportation and lodging expenses of the trusted servants representing them at a Forum...The purpose of Local Forums is to bring Forum information to A.A. members in remote, sparsely populated areas, urban neighborhoods or underserved A.A. communities..Any A.A. community or service entity may request a one-and-a-half or two day Local Forum...Unlike Regional Forums, the responsibility for Forum expenses such as meeting room rental and miscellaneous expenses are assumed by the Local Forum Committee... As all Forums are intended to be sharing sessions, no formal actions result (they) carry A.A.’s message of love and service by improving communication at all levels of our Fellowship.”

GENERAL MEETING – TUESDAY, DECEMBER 20, 2011

CHAIRPERSON'S OPENING REMARKS: Barbara H. (Rox Glen Traditional), **Executive Committee Chairperson:** Barb invited **Wes B.** (Long Branch) to read a Christmas message from Bill W. (from the Grapevine Christmas 1944 edition). The members of the Executive Committee then introduced themselves to Floor members. There was a collection of the 7th Tradition, which totaled **\$147.12**.

ADOPTION OF MINUTES – November 2011: MOTION to adopt Minutes as presented moved by **Amanda** (Noon Rap) and seconded by **Molly** (Willowdale). **MOTION CARRIED.**

Finance Report: Harold Y. (Port Credit), **Finance Chairperson** GTA Intergroup Alcoholics Anonymous. **Finance Report for November 2011.**

Literature and Medallion Sales in November are higher than expected; 13% over the budgeted amount. Year-to-date literature sales are at 99% of the budgeted expectation.

Our Total Income before Operating Expenses for November 2011 is 6% below the projected budget.

We are above budget for Gratitude Income for November 2011. Our YTD income from Gratitude is at 96% of the budget. Total expenses for the month of November are below budget by 35%. Year-to-date total expenses are 93% of budget.

Our YTD Net Ordinary Income is much higher than budgeted. The YTD budget was expecting a loss; we are 170% over this budgeted loss.

RECEPTION: Bruce D. (Fifth Tradition), **Executive Committee member/Liaison:** 39 Reps/Alternates, 22 visitors, and 7 others were present at this meetings.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS FROM PREVIOUS MEETINGS

MOTION to re-list the groups, **Beyond Belief** and **We Agnostics** moved by Allison B. (Responsibility) and seconded by Don (Markham Village). (*Motion presented at the November 2011 General Meeting*).

Regarding the above Motion, a **letter from our Area 83 Delegate, Robb W.** was made available for Reps at this meeting, and is attached to these Minutes. Barbara asked Reps to please read this letter and take back to their groups for discussion.

At the Executive Committee meeting in December, it was decided to invite three speakers on the 'pro' side (to re-list the 2 delisted groups) and the 'con' side (no to re-list) to address the Floor at this meeting, to aid in discussion. **This Motion will be voted on in March**, and discussion will occur over the next few months.

'Pro' Side: John (Widening Our Gateway) was hoping that the Executive Committee could reinstate the Agnostic Group Reps so they could address the Floor, and asked if this item could be reconsidered. Barbara replied that this will be discussed at the next Executive Committee meeting, and will return an answer at the January General Meeting. John added that we don't know what the Agnostic Groups have to say on the matter, and it would be helpful to know what they think in order to make an adequate vote.

'Con' Side: Dee T. (Streetsville) shared that this Floor has already made a decision to de-list the two groups beyond Belief and We Agnostics. He added that he is an Agnostic, but he has never felt unwelcome at an AA meeting. Nobody tells anybody in AA what to believe. AA is the very best opportunity for recovery, and that includes the 12 Steps. We have a responsibility to protect AA.

'Pro' Side: Mike C. (Beverly Hills) stated that 'Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow' is not Conference-approved; yet it is read at almost every meeting in the GTA. He felt that if we wanted someone to speak adequately for the "pro" side, it should be a member from one of the two Agnostic Groups that were delisted. He felt strongly that this would be the fair.

'Con' Side: Don C. (Keep It Simple) stated that a decision had been made to de-list the two groups is question. AA hasn't changed for 70 years; it is a God-based program. There is no need to modify the 12 Steps even if you are an Agnostic or Atheist. He believes that there should be no modified Steps. He inquired as to whether there was a process in place for listing new groups with GTA Intergroup.

Molly (Willowdale) asked for direction with regards to this Motion, as she is a new Rep. Barbara directed her to read previous Minutes for the information and the process that occurred. She also emphasized that this primary issue was the re-written 12 Steps.

By way of providing information, **Aaron K.** (Yorkville) shared that he was on the Agnostic website, and there were several links to Treatment Centres, etc. The 'flavour' of this site was contrary to the Traditions. It seemed to be promoting Agnosticism. AA is a spiritual program. He didn't see why the 12 Steps needed to be changed. It is contrary to what the AA fellowship needs for unity.

Mike (Bloordale) asked that, since we don't have a lot of input from the "pro" side, can we as Floor members decide to have a member of one of the Agnostic Groups speak? Can we get a Sense of the Floor on this item? **Wes B.** (Long Branch) stated that these members currently do not have a voice on the Floor, as they have been de-listed. We need to change Procedures in order for this to happen.

Barbara then asked for a Sense of the Floor: Can we have a point of view from an Agnostic Group member? Twenty-nine Reps agreed to allow a member of the Agnostic Groups to address the Floor with eight opposed. The Floor agreed that an Agnostic Group member can address the Floor.

Brian N. (Beyond Belief) addressed the Floor. He is convinced that members present want to fulfill our Primary Purpose. He is also convinced that people here wouldn't want to harm AA in any way. Fundamentally we all want the same thing. What the Agnostic Groups did in the past was not detrimental...different, but not detrimental. The Agnostic Groups have something to offer GTA Intergroup, and these groups would like to be reinstated. He had a feeling that the Beyond Belief Group would remove the altered Steps.

Bill (Group?) shared that he brought this matter back to his home group, and as there was some confusion the group asked 'What are we really fighting about?' He admitted he couldn't provide an adequate answer. He therefore wants to know that everyone is voting on the exact same thing, and asked the Executive Committee to frame the question for better debate at business meetings. Barbara referred Bill to the Motion made at the December General Meeting, which pertains to this issue (on Page 3 of these Minutes).

Aaron O. (Welcome) added that this debate is recorded in past General Meeting Minutes (available on our website www.aatoronto.org) and asked that Reps encourage other groups to send Reps to this forum for better representation.

'Con' Side: **Wes B.** (Long Branch): The Twelfth step mentions "a spiritual awakening as the result of these Steps..." we don't have the right to change the very foundation of our program. There have been many Agnostic members who have stayed sober using the 12 Steps. He mentioned that he has a spirituality that he learned in AA. There are 312 12-Steps-based programs; people have wanted to use amended 12 Steps to start other fellowships, and they have. In order to change the Step in AAs, we need a 75% majority of all members to do so. **Wes** felt that we need to have some criteria in the future about listing new groups with GTA Intergroup. This body has a right to decide what happens in the GTA. Although we are not part of the AA General Service Structure, we follow their suggestions (i.e. General Service Conference, Area Delegates).

'Pro' Side: **Bob** (Twelve Traditions) mentioned he has been around for about 20 years. He felt that "throwing people out of AA" should not happen. The whole issue is the website; if we list the Agnostic Groups, it should not be a problem. We need a 75% vote to change the 12 Steps; that's not what's being done. Everyone here should read them... they seem pretty innocent.

NEW BUSINESS

MOTION is put forward by the Port Credit Group to change the GTA Intergroup Procedures and Guidelines wherever necessary to make it clear that an AA group needs to adopt the 12 Steps, 12 Traditions and 12 Concepts of AA; as adopted by the AA General Service Board in order to be recognized as an AA group by GTA Intergroup. Motion made by **Eric K.** (Port Credit), and seconded by **Dee T.** (Streetsville Group). As this Motion requires a change to the Procedures, **there will be discussion next month**, and then the **Motion goes back to the groups**. There will be a **Referendum Vote in three months**.

MOTION: The Trial & Error Group moves that the Widening Our Gateway Group be suspended from any involvement at Toronto Intergroup. This group uses a set of steps other than the original steps used by AA for over 75 years contained in the Big Book and the Twelve and Twelve. Motion moved by **Dan H.** (Trial & Error) and seconded by **Jim O.** (Markland Wood). Explanation: Their meetings are conducted in the same manner as the Beyond Belief & We Agnostics Groups, using a set of steps other than those accepted and used by AA for over 75 years. They have been listed and unlisted on the website with these two groups since the last Intergroup meeting. I [Dan] have attended all three of these meetings and they use their own set of steps rather than the 12 Steps of AA. There will be a **discussion of this Motion next month**.

MOTION to change the Guidelines portion of the Procedures and Guidelines to specify use of the current version of Robert's Rules of Order rather the stated specific version by **Wes B.** (Long Branch) and seconded by **Mike B.** (Bloordale). A vote was taken and the MOTION CARRIED.

CHAIRPERSON'S CLOSING REMARKS: There being no further business, the meeting closed with the Responsibility Pledge.

NEXT GENERAL MEETING: Tuesday, January 31 at 8 p.m. at Timothy Eaton Memorial Church, 230 St. Clair Ave. West (west from St. Clair subway station on the Yonge line). The meeting will be held in the Flora McCrae auditorium.
