This year's theme comes from the chapter "A vision for you," which describes Bill and Bob's encounter with the person who would become AA member number three. The Big Book describes that experience as follows:

Hopelessness was written large on the man's face as he replied: "Oh, but that's no use. Nothing would fix me. I'm a goner. The last three times I got drunk on the way home from here. I'm afraid to go out the door. I can't understand it."

For an hour, the two friends told him about their drinking experiences.

Over and over, he would say: "That's me. **That's me. I drink like that.**"

Your 2019 ORC committee has been hard at work to bring you a conference that best reflects how simple and profound that statement can be for people like us. We hope to see you in 2019, March 1 to 3, where the question that loomed large in many a newly sober alcoholics' mind of, "am I to be consigned to a life where I shall be stupid, boring and glum or have you a sufficient substitute?" can be answered with a definitive "yes, we have such a substitute."

- On Dec. 12, 1934, Bill W. has a spiritual experience in Towns Hospital & finds relief from obsession with alcohol.
- On Dec. 1934, Bill & Lois start attending Oxford Group meetings.

- On Dec. 15, 1934, Ebby gave Bill W. a copy of William James book "The Variety of Religious Experience." It deeply inspired Bill by revealing 3 key points for recovery:1. Calamity or complete defeat in a vital area of life (or what we call "hitting bottom"). 2. Admission of defeat (or what we call acceptance). 3. Appeal to a higher power
- for help (or what we call "surrender"). These key points are also the basis for Steps 1, 2 & 3.
- From Dec. 1934 to May 1935, Bill W. works with alcoholics, but fails to sober any of them.
- In Dec. 1937 Bill meets with Rockefeller Foundation in an attempt to get money.
